A few historical comments on the University of Piraeus:

Founded in 1938 as the School for Industrial Studies by the Industrialists and Tradesmen Association.

After three major organizational transformations, presently the University has nine Departments and offers a series of undergraduate, graduate and doctoral degrees.

Each year 2.100 new undergraduate students join the university, which, in addition has 2.060 masters students and 270 doctoral ones. Its faculty is comprised of 250 (all terminally qualified) individuals.


